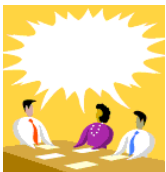

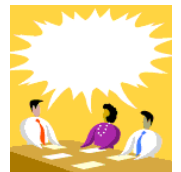

Lt. Gov. Woehler reported that \$300,000 has been spent on TAG by Kiwanis International and membership numbers worldwide have continued to decline. There are 5,000 fewer members in the United States and 339 fewer in the Pacific Northwest District. Norm Olson, TCI club member, stated that big cities tend to have fewer clubs. Statistics show that 25% of the membership decline can be attributed to television and commuting times. The average person watches a minimum of four hours of television per day.



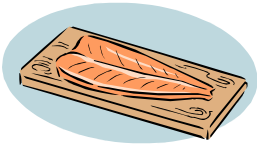

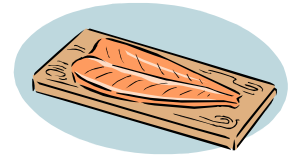
FRENZY AT THE FEVER

CLUB REPORTS



WALLA WALLA CLUB - Walla Walla Club President Nonda Gibbard reported that they will have one more new member in a week or so and they have presented six scholarships. They are planning for their fundraising activities at the fair booth.

HORSE HEAVEN HILLS CLUB - This new Division 54 club was officially organized on April 9th and received their charter on June 9th. The club began with 49 members – 24 transfers from the Kennewick Club and 25 brand new Kiwanians. Three new members will be inducted at the July 16th regular club meeting. A K-Kids Club has been formed at Virgie Robinson Elementary in Pasco and another club being formed at Eastgate Elementary in Kennewick. Three delegates will attend the Tacoma Convention, club members attended the Charter Presentation for the new club in Echo, Oregon and our Round Robin will be completed as soon as the club visits Milton-Freewater. The club has completed two services projects, two fundraising activities and working on the Salmon Feast, the Frenzy at the Fever, staffing ushering and ticket taking at the Benton-Franklin Fair, selling beverages and pastries at the Benton-Franklin Fair Parade and hosting a giant yard sale in September. The Horse Heaven Hills Club will host the September 12th Division Council meeting at Camp Kiwanis.

RICHLAND CLUB - The club has presented five \$1,000 scholarships and will provide \$5,000 annual support to the club Foundation.

PASCO CLUB - The club participated in Canstruction® at Columbia Center Mall, May 30th through June 8th. This is a community event and all food used to build the structures is donated to Second Harvest Tri-Cities. The activity was a great team-building and supported by several club members – older, younger, newer and tenured members. The club received the “Best Use of Labels” award.

KENNEWICK CLUB – The club’s community service committee is organizing a service day to benefit Habitat for Humanity. Tentatively the date has been set for September 18th. A trophy will be presented to the club that provides the most service – specifics will be presented at a later date.

TRI-CITY INDUSTRY CLUB – Carrie Green, Executive Director for the 3 Rivers Community Foundation was inducted and they contributed \$218 to the Tri-City Food Bank. They are selling Frenzy at the Fever and Salmon Bake tickets and contributed money to send students to convention in Portland. There were three new and four continuing scholarships funded by the TCI Foundation.

COLUMBIA CLUB - The club has inducted one new member and researching “Line for Life”. A magnet on the refrigerator will contain a packet that has medical information for a senior living in the home.

ATOMIC CITY – The club has five new members that are the result of a rally. A stipend was received for painting the Benton REA building and contributions were made to SIGN and the Tri-City Food Bank. Frenzy at the Fever and Salmon Bake tickets are being sold.

MILTON-FREEWATER CLUB – The club has had a rummage sale – there is something new all of the time. 5% of the membership is doing 95% of the work.
